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Introduction to RMIT

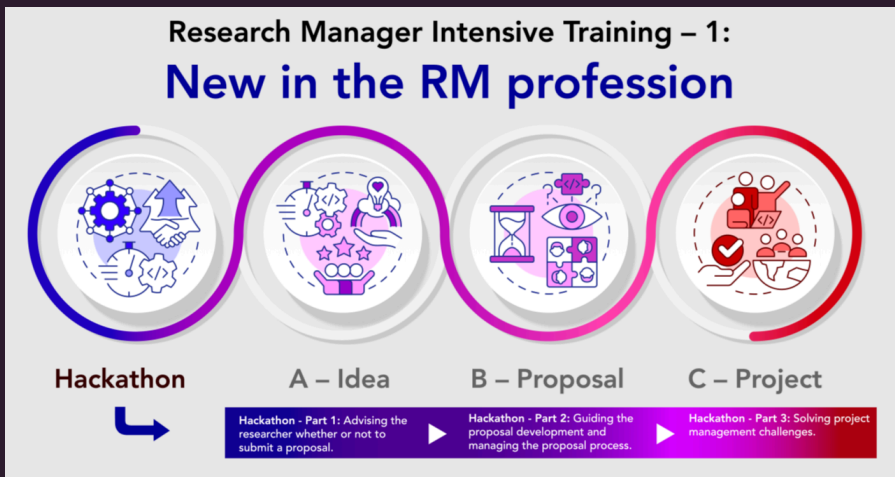
The Research Manager Intensive Training (RMIT) programme is designed to boost research managers' professional development and increase their efficiency through carefully tailored sessions that combine a broad perspective with an individual approach.



RMIT's first course "New in the RM Profession" is open to all research managers with 0 to around 2 years of experience from any type of research performing or funding organisation, such as universities, universities of applied sciences, colleges, public or private research institutes, research & development companies, research funders and government agencies.

RMIT-1 training set-up

RMIT-1 is built around three core training blocks, covering the full research project lifecycle - from idea to impact. Designed from a research management perspective, it focuses on the added value that RMs bring to the process. A simulated realistic project based on an actual Horizon Europe call creates a unique, hackathon-style training experience.
